THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF THE APRIL 9, 2009 CNAC MEETING

The following edits to the March meeting summary were recommended:

- Line 43 delete "both" (before ORANG)
 - Line 72 "Decent" should be "Descent"
 - Line 123 should be "meetings"
 - Line 134 should be "suggested"

There was a motion to accept the meeting summary with the above edits. The motion was seconded and passed.

REVIEW OF THE MARCH MEETING SUMMARY & ANNOUNCEMENTS - MARYHELEN KINCAID

Maryhelen introduced Major Rick Morris from the Oregon Air National Guard as the new CNAC Technical Advisory Group (TAG) member who will represent ORANG. The former ORANG representative, Lt. Col. Beauchamp, has been reassigned.

Maryhelen thanked the Noise Department's former intern, Erica Muse, for the tremendous amount of research and work done on behalf of CNAC. Erica transferred from the Noise Department to General Aviation, however Maryhelen asked that word got back to her regarding how grateful CNAC was for all of her work.

The Public Advisory Group (PAG) for Airport Futures will be forming a Public Involvement committee. A major task of this new committee will be the review of the master plan and new Plan District which will be created for PDX. Vicki Thompson (CNAC representative on PAG), Maryhelen Kincaid and Kelly Sweeney are all members of the PAG public involvement subcommittee that is making recommendations for the formation of the new ongoing committee.

Maryhelen stated CNAC will continue as a stand-alone committee after the Airport Futures project is completed and that the new Public Involvement Committee will work in collaboration with CNAC.

A motion was made to have at least one representative from CNAC sit on the new Public Involvement Committee. Depending on recommendations made by the PAG subcommittee formulating the structure of this committee, the CNAC member could act as a technical advisor to the new committee or be a full voting member. Motion seconded and passed.

CNAC COMMUNITY/NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING SUMMARIES – MARYHELEN KINCAID

 A form for CNAC members was presented to use as a reporting tool after they have attended a neighborhood or community meeting. The purpose of the form is to summarize the key points of the meeting (location, audience, topics of discussion, follow-on actions, etc.). These reports will be used so members can report to the committee about outreach activity. Additionally, it will be helpful to the Port for tracking neighborhood involvement.

Kelly Sweeney suggested there should be a place to write who the key contacts were at the meeting that was attended. Joe suggested simplifying the form.

Maryhelen suggested a form of this type is good for tracking who attended what meeting and the results or comments of the meeting. Joe Smith pointed out that the results of the community meetings are subjective. The form will be modified based on input from CNAC and finalized.

CDA OVERHEAD APPROACH UPDATE - MARYHELEN KINCAID/JASON SCHWARTZ

Jason passed out documentation containing the final counts of CDA overheads conducted, as well as the number of complaints, inquiries, and calls in support of the CDA overhead and/or ORANG in general. The report summarized the data from the 6-month test (October 2008-March 2009). Additionally, a letter submitted by a Cully resident in support of ORANG was distributed.

A great deal of discussion took place between the committee and Jeff Hwang of the ORANG about the CDA. A weekend "fly-day" was proposed to allow CNAC members and other interested stakeholders including the public, to witness the procedure for themselves. The intent was to give CNAC and members of the public the opportunity to observe the CDA overhead approach prior to CNAC making a recommendation as to the future use of the procedure at PDX. Discussion resulted in postponing CNAC's final recommendation until September. The "fly day" is planned for this summer but will require coordination among ORANG, FAA, and the Port. Once a date is finalized, notice will be shared with those who are interested. Jason suggested a CNAC task force be initiated to assist with scheduling and coordination of the work related to the CDA overhead approach. Joe Smith, Koto Kishida, and Paul Speer volunteered to participate on this task force.

A motion was passed to postpone until no earlier than July and no later than September a final CNAC recommendation so that a public fly day can take place. The motion was seconded and passed.

INTRODUCTION OF KOTO KISHIDA – MARYHELEN KINCAID

Koto Kishida was introduced as the new CNAC representative for the City of Portland. Koto has lived in the Cully neighborhood for four years and has a science background. She currently works in water quality for DEQ. Koto gave a brief history of herself and why she was interested in joining CNAC.

CNAC 2009 PRIORITIZATION MATRIX – MARYHELEN KINCAID

Maryhelen began a discussion of the 2009 Prioritization Matrix from the Planning meeting held in February.

Maryhelen suggested Jason schedule another meeting to review and formalize the topics on the Prioritization Matrix. She is also hopeful that a method can be developed wherein the CNAC is kept apprised of the status of the identified projects as they progress.

A suggestion by Koto regarding the Matrix was that an introductory paragraph may be helpful in an effort to educate those who were unable to attend the meeting or did not attend the meeting because [in her case] they were not yet a member of CNAC.

Following further discussion on the Matrix, it was decided routine updates will be provided to CNAC on the progress of the topics identified.

Noise Management Updates – Jason Schwartz

Jason reported he has been working on the Annual Report to Jurisdictions report which he hopes to have drafted by the May 14th meeting. He solicited volunteers to whom he could send a draft of the report for editing and suggestions. Joe Smith and Steve Kerman volunteered to help with this report.

NEIGHBORHOOD AND AIRPORT NOISE REPORTS, JUNE MEETING AGENDA - MARYHELEN KINCAID

Maryhelen reported that Art Spillman and Dennis Sandstrom had visited the East Columbia neighborhood and done a presentation on NREX. She reported that she, Jason and Kelly Sweeney would be making a presentation on CNAC at the May 6th East Portland Neighborhood Organization (EPNO) board meeting.

Kelly reported attending meetings of the Esther Short and Vancouver Heights Neighborhood Associations, both in Vancouver. Kelly introduced himself and gave a brief overview of the role of CNAC and provided contact information for the Noise Management Department. Feedback received by the Noise Management Department following Kelly's visit was very positive.

Kelly and Joe also attended the Parkrose Heights Neighborhood (Portland) Association meeting. They each made brief introductions and provided information about CNAC and how to reach the Noise management department for questions or concerns about aircraft noise or to speak with a CNAC representative.

Joe Smith also attended the Argay Neighborhood Association (Portland) meeting on March 17th.

THE MEETING BEGAN AT 6:00 PM AND ENDED AT 8:11 PM.

There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm.
