- **1.** The VIP program launched in 1993 with just 13 volunteers. Today there are 142 active volunteers, including Bob Edwards who started in the first year of the program.
- **2.** Four performers have been with us since the beginning of the entertainment program in 2001 Marvin Case, John English, Bill Fischer and Kay Robbins.
- **3.** VIPs help travelers 365 days a year, from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m., contributing a total of 23,000 hours annually.
- **4.** With more than 60 three-hour performances each week, our entertainers provide more than 10,000 hours of beautiful music each year.
- **5.** Our oldest VIPs are 93-year-old Mary Jane Hall and 92-year-old Ellen Riseley.



- **6.** PDX entertainers include 12 pianists, seven guitarists and eight vocalists. Instruments include a steel drum, marimba, pan flute, accordion, ukulele and kazoo.

The sculpture is a rain gear outfit that represents the theme "Less Waste, More World" and addresses air quality, water resources, energy, natural resources and waste minimization. Materials include disposable coffee cups, parking garage tickets, scrap electrical wire, and plant material from the Living Machine in the Port of Portland headquarters building. ## **MOD Pizza Steps Up to the Plate**



When traveling, it's easy to assume that your order needs to be placed "to go." But more often than not, food is eaten in the terminal, not on the plane.

At MOD Pizza PDX, this ordering predicament was causing pizza boxes to quickly fill up the garbage receptacles on Concourse C. Plates seemed like a wise alternative, so Port of Portland property manager Walt Marchbanks and MOD teamed up with Asean Corporation. Together they produced a custom die for a branded 12-inch plate made from sugar cane fiber, a renewable resource.

The immediate impact was impressive. Before the plate project, approximately 27,772 pounds of pizza boxes were going to the landfill each year – the equivalent of nine Honda Civics. After plates were in use, it dropped to 19,763 – a yearly savings of 8,099 pounds of waste.

"At MOD, we're all about peoples' stories and the journeys that have led them to where they are today," Justin Cole, MOD general manager, said. "We want to impact the environment in a positive way so it can join us on our journey as well. When you eat at MOD, please be sure to pick the plate!"
