# **Environmental Costs**

Each "Facility User" will be responsible for all costs associated with response to, or abatement of any spills, releases, or discharges of pollution, invasive species, or

hazardous materials into the air, land, groundwater or waterways in the vicinity of Port marine terminal facilities, and/or on Port property that emanate from or are caused by its vessel, equipment, or operations. If a Facility User does not immediately commence cleanup, the Port may undertake clean up operations, and the Facility User will reimburse the Port for all such costs within thirty (30) days of written demand by the Port. Rates for the services performed will be billed at the labor rates and equipment rates shown in the following rate tables. With respect to invasive species, recoverable environmental costs include without limitation costs associated with quarantine, fumigation, pesticide or herbicide application, and actions taken at the request of state or federal authorities with authority over invasive species control.
